Lola holds her little boy, recently healed from malaria through the prayers of Christians, as she silently listens to those who have been sent to tell her family the Good News. Lola is Bozo (BOH-zoh). As fishermen, life for her people is interwoven with the rivers of western Africa. Most Bozo identify with Islam, while also praying to their ancestors. There are four Bozo language dialects, and while translation is underway, the Bible in any of these dialects is still far off. The Gospel cannot wait.

- Pray for Lola and her family to accept Christ and grow in relationship with Him.
- Of the over 300,000 Bozo, there are only a few who profess Christ. Pray that God would strengthen these believers to tell others and through this witness multiply the number of believers exponentially.
- Ask God to send forth believers willing to live the life of faith required to see the Bozo believe.
- Pray that as the Gospel is shared clearly, those seeds would break forth into an abundant harvest of Bozo believers.
- Pray that the Bozo, known as the "Fishers of Mali," would hear and receive the Gospel message, transforming them into "Fishers of Men."
