Reports indicate Islam is spreading across Chad. Influenced by both African traditional religion and Islam, the Karanga (kah-RAH-ngah) lead a difficult life. Living in semi-arid southern Chad, the Karanga are dependent upon yearly rains as they till the soil, growing groundnuts (peanuts), sesame, wheat and other grains. In recent years drought and pestilence have damaged their crops. The Karanga can relate to biblical stories about sowing seed and harvesting grain. Christians can use this bridge to help them understand the One who causes all things to grow.

- Pray for open doors of witness to the 110,000 Karanga living in Chad.
- Ask God to burden the hearts of believers with messages of truth for the Karanga.
- Ask God to give believers a strategic vision and creative logistical planning to reach the Karanga.
- Pray that God would raise up persons of peace in Karanga villages who'll be ready to help those coming with the Gospel message.
- Ask God to call up those willing to step out of their comfort zone and live among the Karanga to give witness of His grace.
- Pray for believers willing to partner in prayer for the Karanga people.
