In addition to the harsh climate, years of war have left scars on the people of southern Sudan. In a place where children are forced into marriage and into armed conflict as child soldiers, it is easy to say “they need the love of Christ” and leave it there. However, the biblical author James says to put actions to your faith. While a portion of the Bible has been translated into a language known by the Lotuho (lu-TWO-hoe) people, numbering 194,000, in recent years there has not been any active church planting among them. God’s all-encompassing grace and forgiveness needs to be shared with those who need it most.

- Human suffering among the peoples of Sudan is great; for example, girls as young as 10 years old are forced into marriage. Pray for God to burden believers to go and share about God’s amazing, saving grace.
- Pray for partnerships to be established between churches and missionaries to reach the unreached of southern Sudan.
- Reaching the Lotuho is a God-sized task that needs a God-sized faith; pray God will open the doors of opportunity and vision to see the Gospel seeds spread among this people group.
