# MAKHUWA- MONIGA

*of Mozambique*



There are a variety of Makhuwa (mah-KOO-ah) tribes living in coastal areas of Mozambique. They are an Islamic people. While some Makhuwa-Moniga (mah-KOO-wah-mo-NEE-ngah) have access to the Gospel in the Portuguese language, the message has not been readily accepted and is not currently available in the Moniga language. The Moniga need an incarnate witness to come and live among them, teaching them the message of God's great and redemptive love. Traditionally, work is slow among Islamic peoples. Seeds of love must be carefully sown and faithfully watered; the Moniga must witness a difference in the lives of believers.

- Ask God to interrupt the lives of the Moniga with dreams and visions that will cause them to ask questions about salvation and eternity.
- Pray God will burden believers with a message for the Moniga.
- Pray that in God's perfect time, He will bring these together to ask questions and share answers about the God of the Universe, who loves people and has made a way of salvation for them through faith.
- Pray for resources to be given enabling an incarnational witness to live among the 208,000 Moniga.
- As God works, pray for spiritual and physical protection over believers.
