A people group out in the middle of nowhere – does God know they exist? Living near the equator in the heart of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), where roads are nonexistent, the Ngando (ng-GHAN-doe) are an isolated people about whom little is known. While there is a translation of the New Testament in the Ngando language, the remoteness of their location, coupled with the vastness of the DRC, means there is little opportunity for the 418,000 Ngando to hear a clear Gospel presentation. But God knows where these people are, and He wants them to hear of His love and mercy.

- Pray for God's chosen to step up, leaving the confines of their comfortable lifestyle, and step out into the jungles of equatorial Africa to share the Gospel message with Ngando who have never heard.
- Pray for increased IMB financing, enabling more research to be done in the DRC so missionaries will better know where to take the Gospel.
- Ask God to burden the hearts of believers to pray for the Ngando and other people groups who live in the remote corners of Africa, that they may have a witness of God's grace among them.
