## Bangi Me

The Bangi Me are a sub-group of the Dogon, who do have an evangelical witness among them. However, the dialect of the Bangi Me is so different from the primary dialects of the Dogon (Toro So and Togo So) that they cannot understand one another much at all.

Among the Bangi Me, the education level is generally very low. Most grow corn or millet to eat. They live in the mountains, constructing round huts along the mountainside, typically near the bottom, as they have to come down regularly to get water and take care of the fields.

The roads in the area where the Bangi Me live are very mountainous, and at times to reach villages one must drive out of the bush to the pavement and around the mountain only to return to about the same area but on the other side of the mountain. Because they live in mountains, reaching their villages may require some climbing, but not much.

There are no known Christian resources in this language.
