Fulani

The Adamawa Fulani are a vast people group that can be found in several countries in Sub-Saharan Africa. Many are nomadic shepherds who travel with their herds in search of better grazing land, but others are farmers who grow sorghum or corn. Milk is a main component of their diet, and they also produce and trade butter. Homes are beehive-shaped huts made of woven twigs, leaves and grass. Children are considered extremely important, since Adamawa Fulani believe a person lives from generation to generation through his children. If a Fulani dies having never had children, he is believed to have died twice.

An Adamawa Fulani holds in his emotions so that no one knows what he is thinking. The ideal Adamawa Fulani is said to be reserved, yet emotionally tied to his herds. He is gentle, yet disdainful of non-Fulani. Adamawa Fulani possess many virtues, including generosity, honesty and modesty.
