Hausa Fulani

The Hausa Fulani are an intermingling of two dominant people groups of western and central Africa (Hausa and Fulani).

Rural areas maintain animism, and Islamic rulers draw from traditional beliefs to keep legitimacy. Maguzawa, the form of animism practiced among the group, includes animal sacrifice for personal gain and the Bori cult of spirit possession. Bori centers on controlling supernatural forces responsible for illnesses via an exorcism ritual.
